### **Hospice Information**

Hospice provides individualized care and support for people with an incurable disease and their loved ones. Care is delivered by a team of expertly trained individuals and is focused on comfort rather than cure, with specific attention to managing pain and symptoms, providing emotional and spiritual support, and helping to meet end-of-life goals. A Hospice care team may include a: physician, registered nurse, nurse practitioner, hospice aide, chaplain, and volunteer.

People can receive hospice care within the following settings:

- at home (most common)
- in the hospital
- at an extended care facility, such as a nursing home
- at a specialized hospice center

#### **Hospice Questions**

### When should I look into Hospice?

- Hospice Care can begin when an illness becomes so advanced it is no longer curable and it is not possible to control it.
- Two physicians, a qualified hospice doctor and a person's primary care doctor, need to <u>certify</u> whether they meet the criteria for hospice care.
- A diagnosis such as cancer, Alzheimer's Disease and other dementias, endstage heart disease, COPD, end-stage kidney disease, stroke, ALS, and others could all make a person eligible to receive hospice care.

### What is the difference between Hospice and Palliative Care?

• Palliative care can occur alongside a curative or life-prolonging treatment while hospice care does not.
